Overview

This guide describes the reports available in ADAM for reviewing student performance on assessments administered via ADAM. ADAM is the assessment platform that supported the Spring 2024 Summative Assessments.

What is LaunchPad?

Launchpad is a unified sign-in that requires a one-time sign-in for access to multiple platforms, which will provide users access to ADAM. Users log in once to LaunchPad and from there SSO to all licensed Pearson applications for their associated district.

What Reports are Available for ADAM Users?

Here is a list of reports and where to find them. If you do not see a report or a section within a report, it is not enabled either for your role or the assessment.

Report Name	Description and Typical Use	Where to Learn More
	Performance Reports (shows performance for a specific assessment)	
Performance Summary	Shows overall student performance at district, school, and student level for a single assessment. (depending on the access of your role)	Pg. 10
Performance Comparison	Shows results that include students that submitted the assessment while enrolled in your organization scope. Report includes scale scores, proficiency, overall achievement levels, and claim levels.	Pg. 12
Student Performance	This report enables school administrators to view results for all students within their scope.	Pg. 13
ISR	When viewing all students within a specific school, ISRs (Individual Student Reports) can be accessed. These reports display results for both Math and ELA for a specific student.	Pg. 13

Performance Dashboard

From within the Performance Dashboard, you can access the Performance Reports for specific assessments.

When you drill down into the Performance Report for a specific administration, you will be able to view schools and/or students depending on your role. Your scope is indicated at the top of the page.

Performance Levels

Performance level details can be found by hovering over the bar chart to see the number of students in that proficiency level, the percent of those students in the proficiency level, and the score range. Performance level(s) with a line underneath are considered proficient and the value is the percent of students considered proficient for the specific assessment at district or school levels. Scale Score

In any report where scale scores are visualized in a bar format, the Scale Score Range provides the min and max value.



Performance Report

The Performance Report shows student performance at institutions (district or school) for a single assessment. You will access all Performance reports from the Performance Dashboard.

Performance Report Summary

The Performance Summary is the default view when you click an assessment title from the Performance Dashboard. It provides an overview of performance across all institutions you have access to (District or School). It shows the performance objectives such as:



Performance Comparison

The Performance Comparison section can be found below the summary section of the Performance Report. This is the area where you can drill down to a specific school (if you have a district level role) or find your way to the student performance report (if you're logged in with a school level role). Only the institutions you have access to will be available within your scope. Please see below:



Within the Performance Comparison section, the Overall Achievement levels, Claim Levels and ELA writing categories can be found. Details regarding performance results for overall achievement and claims are displayed by hovering over the bar graphs.



Student Performance

The Student Performance report displays results for a single test for all students within a school. This report lets school administrators to view all students. The report includes the **Performance Summary** and a **Performance Comparison** section. You can access a student's **ISR** from here by clicking their name.

To view results by student:

- 1. Navigate to a Performance report as described previously
- 2. If not already at a school level, drill down to a school
- 3. At the school level, click the 'kabob' menu and select Student Performance

4. At the top of the Student Performance Report, you'll find the **Performance Summary** section where summary information for **Score Group Details** as well as a bar graph for **Score Groups** can be viewed.

5. Below the Performance Summary section is the Performance Comparison where you can:

- View the scale scores for all students in the list
- Sort by Student, Scale Score, Overall Achievement Levels, Claims, and Writing Categories (for ELA only). See below:

6. Click a student name to view their Individual Student Report.

Individual Student Results (ISR) Report

The Individual Student Results (ISR) report shows individual student performance. It will include performance across Mathematics and English Language Arts. This report can be accessed by clicking on the student's name (seen in previous section) in the Student Performance Report or an ISR export (printable versions) can be requested using the following steps.

To access an ISR export:

- 1. Go to Reporting > Performance
- 2. Select a Program
- 3. Click anywhere in a test row to open the Performance Report

4. **ISR Export** buttons can be found in 2 areas on the **Performance Report**, next to the Export Report button and in the kabob for a school. See below:

When an ISR is accessed, either individual or in an export, both Mathematics and ELA reports are provided. Below is a sample of an ISR for a student in grade 7:

The student has met the achievement standard and demonstrates progress toward mastery of the knowledge and skills in English language arts/literacy needed for likely success in future coursework.

A student's test score can vary if the test is taken several times. If this student was tested again, it is likely that the scale score would be + or - this number of their current scale score.

Student Achievement by English Language Arts Claim

The student results are also reported out into the four claims (i.e. areas) that together make up English Language Arts: Reading, Writing, Listening, and Research & Inquiry. These four claims are based on Smarter Balanced's academic standards, which describe the knowledge and skills students are expected to learn for this grade.

Writing Essay Purpose: Narrative

Students write an extended response (i.e., essay) with one of the following purposes: narrative, opinion, informational, explanatory, or argumentative. The student received the following scores on the essay:

Writing Essay Category	Writing Essay Score
Evidence/Elaboration (4 points max)	3
Organization/Purpose (4 points max)	3
Conventions (2 points max)	1
